Every year, the Hilliard City Schools Transition/Work-Study Program, in cooperation with other Central Ohio School Transition programs, sponsors a College Night Seminar for students who are interested in postsecondary education and who want to take advantage of the accommodations (in college it's called academic adjustments) that they received in high school to help level the playing field as they pursue their future academic career goals.

There will be representatives on the panel from the Office of Disability Services of the following schools to answer your questions: Hocking College, Columbus State Community College, DeVry University, Otterbein University, Wright State University, Ohio University, The Ohio State University, Sinclair Community College, OSU Newark Campus, Muskingum University, Defiance College and Military Recruiter.

Every college has an Office of Disability Services to assist students who had IEP'S or 504 Plans in high school, but each school delivers services in their own way. You will need to visit the Office of Disability Services and ask questions about their specific services when you do your college visits.

Here's some questions to ask:

What academic adjustments will your school provide ?

What documents do I need to bring to your school to prove I have a disability?

How will your services be different from high school?

Will my professors know I need an academic adjustment? Who will tell them?

Will someone from your office of disability services stay in contact with my parents?

Who can I talk to if I'm unhappy with my services?
